SAFETY AND COMMUNITY TIPS

Walkers

Bicyclists

Drivers

Bicycles are allowed to share the road, so please be cautious when passing them. Stick to the speed limits, especially since there are many children on bikes and the roads have curves with potential blind spots. Let's all take our time to ensure everyone's safety.

Dog Owners

Don't forget to pick up after your furry friends. Nobody likes stepping in that mess!

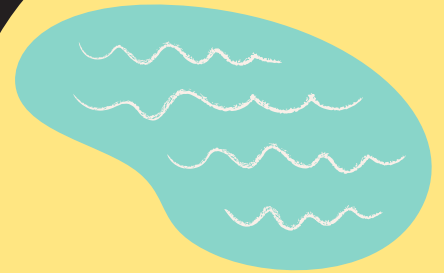
Understanding Pennsylvania's Vehicle Code, Title 75

Here are a few key points about the rights and responsibilities of pedestrians and drivers:

Crosswalks:

- Pedestrians must yield to vehicles when crossing at locations other than crosswalks, pedestrian tunnels, or overhead crossings. Always be cautious and make sure it's safe before crossing.
- Drivers must yield to pedestrians crossing at both marked and unmarked crosswalks at intersections.
- Drivers should not overtake vehicles stopped at crosswalks.
- Pedestrians should cross only at crosswalks, look both ways, and wait for a gap in traffic. Make eye contact with drivers to ensure they see you.

By following these guidelines, we can all enjoy a safer and more pleasant community. Thank you for your cooperation!

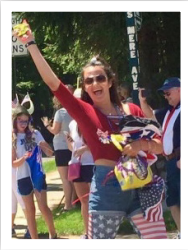

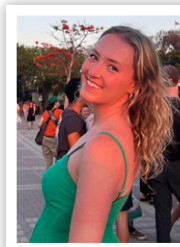
ELLIE HILGENDORFF

QUINN HILGENDORFF

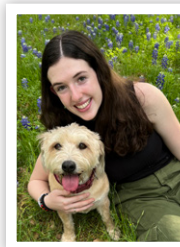

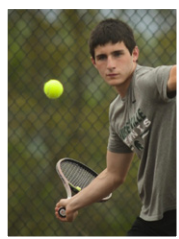
PORTER REESE

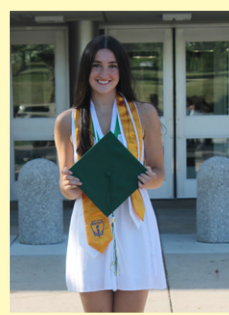


ANDREW WARD

Peter Rickles graduated from Tulane University with a double finance and legal studies major. In September, he will be moving to New York to work as a consultant for Huron.

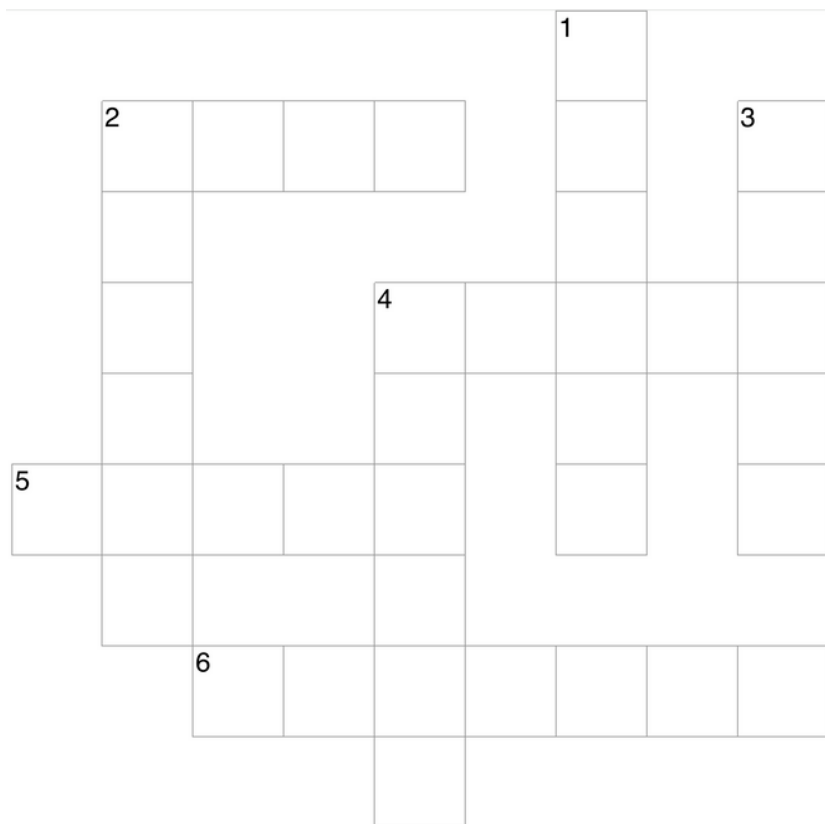

What are they?

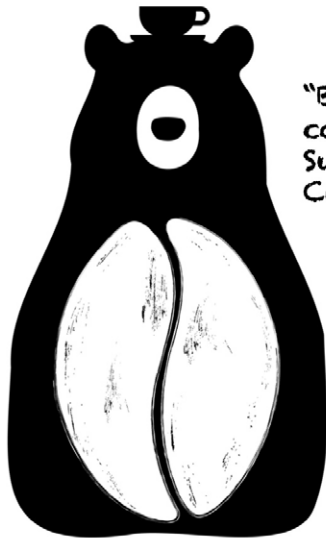
MUSICAL CHAIRS
